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Academic Articulation Agreement

Georgia Northwestern Technical College and Troy University

This Articulation Agreement between Georgia Northwestern Technical College (GNTC) (TROY) serves to identify the general nature of the articulation agreement. This agreement will foster inter-institutional cooperation which can be determined by both parties. This agreement is the other party of intention to do so. This agreement shall be in effect for a period of five (5) years, but not to be earlier than the term in process, wishing to transfer to TROY:

1. Both parties shall be bound by the Commission on Colleges (ACCJC) standards.
2. Upon completion of an Associate's degree from GNTC, students officially admitted according to the admissions requirements as established by TROY.
3. Transfer students will be eligible for unconditional admission to TROY with a 2.0 grade point average (GPA) on a 4.0 scale on at least 12 semester hours.
4. Transfer credits from GNTC will be accepted by TROY in accordance with the attached transfer matrix. Transferable courses include English Comp I, English Comp II, Math, and some specified major/minor courses as indicated in the TROY catalog.
5. Transferability of CELEP, DSST, ALEKS placement credit, and credit earned by TROY.
6. Transfer students must submit an official transcript from GNTC forwarded to Troy University Admissions Office.
7. The attached transfer matrix lists transferable courses.
8. All transfer students must earn a minimum of 25% of all degree program hours in residency at TROY in order to graduate from TROY with a Bachelor's degree.
9. All transfer students must earn a minimum of 90% of all degree program hours with academic credit (excludes credit by exam) to graduate from TROY with a Bachelor's degree.
10. Changes to this articulation agreement and other...

- Commission on Higher Education, the Georgia Department of Education or any other state or accrediting agency could result in specific requirement being added to this agreement and must be agreed on by both parties.
11. Transfer students serving a suspension from GNTC are eligible to apply for admission to TROY after serving the suspension period from GNTC. Students on disciplinary suspension must be eligible to return to GNTC before being considered for admission to TROY.
  12. TROY will provide students the opportunity to complete a baccalaureate level degree and above.
  13. The TROY Office of the Registrar and the GNTC Office of the Registrar will evaluate the effectiveness of this process annually and recommend modification and changes to each other as needed.
  14. In concert with the GNTC Office of Communication and Marketing, the TROY Marketing Department will create marketing materials, print ads, and other media materials (the "Outreach Materials") to be used in outreach to local prospective students about the program and the benefits of earning an GNTC associate's and TROY bachelor's degree.
  15. Marketing materials will be shared and approved by both parties in advance.
